The Poems of Üftade

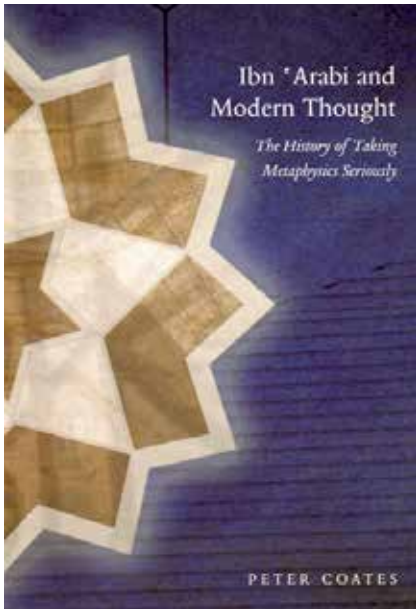

These three Lebanese writers emigrated to the USA early in life. There, in the early 20th century, together with other Syrian and Lebanese émigrés, they were spurred into writing and setting up an Arabic-language press. The result became known as the Syro-American School, a fusion of Eastern sentiment with Western forms, and a cultural cross-fertilisation in both directions.
